

Meet the Directors



Ms. Madison Murphy is a 2021 graduate of Westminster Choir College of Rider University, where she earned her Bachelor of Music in Music Education. After student teaching at Pond Road Middle School in the spring, Madison is thrilled to be able to join the PRMS family as a Long-Term Leave Replacement for Mr. PJ Heckman during the fall semester. Madison has performed in choirs all over the United States and around the world, most notably performing Bach's Mass in B Minor and Ravel's L'enfant et les Sortilèges with the Philadelphia Orchestra. Madison has sung with world renowned choral conductors such as Yannick Nézet-Séguin, James Jordan, Joe Miller, Amanda Quist, and more. These choral experiences have allowed Madison to share her passion and extensive knowledge of choir with the students of Pond Road Middle School this semester.





Brian Williams, a lover of choral music, first encountered this art form at the end of middle school and has been obsessed ever since. Part of the first graduating class at Robbinsville High School, he continued his studies at Westminster Choir College where he graduated with a Bachelors degree in Music Education and a Masters Degree in Teaching. This year marks Brian's tenth year teaching in the Robbinsville public schools. Outside of the curricular school day, Brian produces for and music directs the Woodbridge Community Players in the summer in addition to working as the music director at Kids and Teens in the Park. He has had the opportunity to work with ensembles and musical acts all over the state, and was honored to direct the first CJMEA middle school honors choir in 2018.

From the Directors

Maddie Murphy Pond Road Middle School Interim Choral Director

In What Sweeter Music, Robert Herrick's Christmas text is beautifully set with an original melody of flowing lines, warm harmonic colors, and an expressive accompaniment by Mary Lynn Lightfoot. The middle section of the piece provides rhythmic interest before a traditional Christmas carol, The First Noel, is quoted to reach a final conclusion. Pond Road Middle School 8th Grader, Lillian Zheng, will be accompanying the choir for this piece.

Pat-a-Pan is a French Christmas carol in Burgundian dialect, later adapted into English. Its original title is "Guillô, Pran Ton Tamborin" ("Willie, Bring Your Little Drum"), which can be heard at the beginning of the piece. The name; "patapan" is meant to mimic the sound of the drum, and the accompanying lyric, "tu-re-lu-re-lu," the flute. This is similar conceptually to the carol "The Little Drummer Boy." The choir will be accompanied by a light rhythmic drum and melodic flute.

Shalom Chaverim is a beautiful, traditional Israeli folk song typically sung in a three-part round. The Hebrew text translates in English to "Peace, friends," though the word shalom has more depth and richness of meaning than can be contained in any single English word.

Brought to a new generation through this rhythmic, "Lion King" inspired African choral arrangement, the familiar **The Lion Sleeps Tonight**, a 1960's pop hit is still honored through the classic "O-Wim-Oweh" vocals which can be heard at the start of the piece. The composition then branches off into the well-known melody, embellished for modern audiences. Small group soloists will be featured throughout this piece.

In the last year and a half I have had the opportunity to work with amazing students on innovating new techniques to keep our passion alive in the midst of a global shutdown. While I am immensely proud of the products and music we created, I kept feeling this tug that something was missing. Singing in an ensemble, creating music live with the people around you, was this monumental gap in my life. The Road Home is a beautiful adaptation of a southern folk song explaining that yearning to find your place, and details the inevitable realization that only by doing what you love will guide you back on a road home. Chamber will finish it's set with Daemon Irrepit Callidus (the demon sneaks expertly), a thrilling and driving chromatic based piece detailing the lengths in which a demon will try to lure you into it's trap. The unsettled nature of the accompaniment and rapid tossing of melody across the choir paints a vivid picture of the struggle I'm sure we all went through last year while trying to record our parts for virtual choirs.

It is monumental news that we are able to sing together this year, and when designing this concert, I wanted to invoke the global feeling of excitement as we are all looking at (I'm knocking on wood when writing this so it counts) a return to normality in our lives. Hands are Knockin' weaves Arabic and English text together to ask the question: if someone was in need around you, would you help them? O Come, All Ye Faithful's arrangement by David Willcocks is by far one of my favorite for this time of year. It is simple and familiar, but is elevated by featuring a soaring soprano descant and deviant minor v chord hidden at the end. Adding the language of Ladino to the mix, Ocho Kandelikas is a fun counting song celebrating the joys of Chanukah. We then transition into the American folk song Amazing Grace, taking the well known tune and laving it over an expanded choral palette. Ola Gieilo's setting of Christina Rosetti's The Rose sounds like a warm blanket wrapping around the room as the choir creates a lush, relentless soundscape as the melody hauntingly goads us forward. Akekho Ofana No Jesu is a South African Traditional that is used to bring people together. Between the rhythmic pulse and the call and response setting, this piece is a perfect way to close our first concert since the shutdown. I'd like to take a moment to thank you dearly for all your support: this concert has been a long time coming and without your encouragement to continue to create, I can guarantee there would not be as many dedicated musicians on this stage. Have a wonderful season, be safe, and see you next year!
